Education Sponsorship

Supporting education - building future

Education Sponsorship programme of BREADS has been playing a prominent role in touching the lives of hundreds of children to dream a brighter future. BREADS has collaborate with local and international organizations and individuals to provide education support for the poor children living in the rural villages and urban slums of Karnataka and Kerala states.



The selection of the children for the sponsorship programme will be based on stringent criteria in order to reach out the deserving children. Majority of our sponsored children belongs to rescued child labourers or the mainstreamed children from the streets. The rural and urban slums children are also part of the education sponsorship programme in order to purse the education in formal schools.

The sponsored children are given motivation, guidance, etc for better academic performance and careers. The children selected for the project is studying in primary classes to higher education include professional degrees.

The sponsorship programmes is managed by BREADS with decentralized structures. BREADS has built good rapport with sponsored children, the sponsors and mentors. Regular interactions and communications are being promoted among all the stakeholders through letters (at least twice in a year), periodical gatherings, motivational trainings, management trainings, personal counseling sessions, career orientation, etc. A computerized data base and documentation system was established for monitoring, financial management, progress assessment, information sharing and partnership building.

The sponsorship is not only providing financial support but also nurturing values, imparting personality and life skill trainings, building an young generation with social responsibility by engaging in social work activities,. The programme follows an integrated approach through which thousands of poor children have already well placed in life and 514 children are still continuing their education.
