Director's Note

The country's 900million registered voters are voting in national elections between April 11 and May 19 across 1million polling stations in 543 constituencies. According to the Election Commission of India data, about 2.6 crore young people in the age bracket of 18 to 20 years have already been registered in the electoral rolls. It is not just their number that is significant but also their characteristics. First-time voters behave differently. They are often better informed, more educated and tech-savvy than the rest of their family, and they can take a stand that goes against the family's established political leanings.

Now, the real question is how well and faithfully have you performed your duty? The General Election 2019 has a highly discussed agenda and we do not intend to repeat the same old phrases again. As citizens, elections are our opportunity to delegate the power and responsibility for the security and development of the country, to be precise, choosing the right people who could stand for your needs and welfare. Elections are our right and we have the complete freedom to use it freely. Our decision should be non-biased, uninfluenced and un-persuaded by any factors such as force, political parties, or personal motives. This is a major challenge faced by many voters who are unable to exercise their voting

rights judiciously. To overcome this challenge, we have to shut our ears to fake promises and fake concern. You know who is fit for the position, and according to your choice you can vote for him/her. Making a wise and prudent decision based on the past performances of candidates is crucial at this point.

During the election campaign period, BREADS joined hands with two NGOs namely, 'Concerned for Working children' (CWC) and 'Wada Na Todo Abhiyan' (WNTA) which popularized the idea of judicious voting through their campaign initiatives. CWC initiated the campaign, 'Me and My vote are not for sale' wherein the goal of the campaign was to influence and support the voters to take charge, to feel empowered, to demand accountability from candidates (before elections) and elected representatives thereafter. Secondly, ingrain the realization that by UPHOLDING THE SANCTITY OF THEIR VOTES they were NOT compromising their right to franchise and thirdly, to mobilise communities, especially the most vulnerable, to identify and prioritise their demands.

In the run-up to the general election in 2019, Wada Na Todo Abhiyan (WNTA- Do not forget your promises), a campaign consisting of above 3500 Community Based Organizations (CBOs) working on 'holding the government accountable on the promises made to the people', initiated the process of meeting different sections of people in rural and urban areas to capture their aspirations/expectations for the election in the form of a 'National People's Manifesto'. WNTA is a non-partisan campaign having no affiliation to any political party. Preparation of people's manifesto is a proactive engagement of citizens in the electioneering process by which it influences the manifesto-making process of different political parties.







"DeshMera, Vote Mera, Mudda Mera" Campaign on 23rd March 2019



The General Election 2019 is already on! While the country was at this crucial time, the security of the nation was threatened and this had the evident impact of shifting the focus of the people from the original motive of the election. "Desh Mera, Vote Mera, Mudda Mera", which is of national significance, was organised with the motive to bring back the focus of the nation to the real issues of the election; such as, unemployment, farm distress, rising inequality, crimes, condition of marginal communities and deficits in the basic welfare provisions. Public meetings, mass awareness and commemoration of the martyrdom of Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev and Rajguru were conducted on 23rd March 2019 in 10 districts of Karnataka state as part of the campaign.

While it is for political parties to contest elections and appeal for votes, it is imperative that civil society organisations, social movements and groups who share a commitment to our constitutional values, co-ordinate their energies to restore a democratic balance. With this intention, five awareness programs, two human chain campaigns, two rallies and two public gatherings were conducted across the ten districts of Karnataka.
