Every year, the International Day of the Girl Child celebrates the girl child, amplifying her voice to stand up for her rights; this year with the theme, "GirlForce: Unscripted and unstoppable". To enhance community awareness, the campaigns highlighted challenges faced by girls such as lack of access to education, sexual and physical exploitation, discrimination, gender-based violence, lack of access to religious places, child marriages, menstruation and reproductive health.
