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

We reached out to people made vulnerable by health issues and circumstances, such as people with leprosy/HIV, the visually and physically challenged, bedridden, elderly and children in institutions, children in conflict with the law/government homes, widows, daily wagers, migrants, slum/street dwellers, tribal/Devadasi/ transgender communities, flood victims, people in quarantine centres and even international refugees referred by the UNHCR. Solidarity was expressed diversely and especially in kind through a great variety of food, masks and sanitary items, educational aids, clothes, counselling and volunteering services.

BREADS values these partnerships as expressions of solidarity with vulnerable people at a vulnerable time!

# Inauguration of Laura Bhavan in Bablad

The inauguration of Laura Bhavan in Bablad, Kalaburagi was a welcome reminder to look beyond coping with COVID 19 in the short term to calibrating our long term goals to include it.



The building was inaugurated in a small ceremony on 23 September 2020 by Fr. Joyce Thonikuzhiyil, Provincial, Sacred Heart Province Bangalore in the presence of Fr. Biju Michael, Regional Councillor, South Asia.

As the planning and development office for Karnataka and Kerala, BREADS has been responding to emergencies regularly. However, the COVID 19 experience has been different—the biggest factors being the novel, highly contagious virus and the need to adhere to various government and health restrictions which impacted movement and scale of response.

BREADS worked around this situation by networking with various agencies and individuals so that they could reach where we couldn't. We became a via media for those people who could help but had no reach and those people who could reach but needed support.

In these six months, BREADS has forged many rich partnerships with varied people in their personal and official capacities in order to reach out to vulnerable people whose lives and livelihoods were most affected by the

virus and the government lockdowns.

We acknowledge with much appreciation this diversity in solidarity—Responsenet, Bosconet, Zomato Feeding India, Solarpack, Hilton Bangalore, Transform Plus, Stonesoup, and Rhoumai for partnering with us in reaching thousands of people with food and hygiene items.

Individual donors came forward to support four special COVID 19 relief drives for tribal families in the Karnataka forest belts; donating new clothes and educational materials for 2153 children and grocery kits for 2134 families there. Partners in these drives were the Karnataka State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (KSCPCR), Good Quest Foundation, Project Vision, Responsenet, AIFO India and Corona Care Bengaluru.
