Raju was just six years old when he was brought to Bosco Mane, Bangalore. He hailed from a family of illiterates and was no stranger to the bitterness of poverty that usually accompanies illiteracy. His father was mentally ill and his mother went away, leaving Raju and his younger brother in the care of his grand-mother. That too, was short-lived, as she also passed away, leaving two little children alone in a strange, loveless world. With no one to take care of them, the children were sent to their uncle and aunt's home. Though they were very happy to take Raju and his brother, their desire to give the children a new home did not work out as the physically challenged couple found it difficult to provide for them. Their situation was brought to the attention of BOSCO (BREADS' partner in Bangalore). After an enquiry into their home situation, the BOSCO staff applied to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) to admit the children to

the BOSCO centre. Raju and his brother were admitted to BOSCO Mane in 2012 and joined St. Joseph's School, Chamrajpete, after completing a bridge course to help them catch up with their lost education.

Raju, now 16 years old, has successfully completed his class 10 with distinction (87%) and will be joining Don Bosco Pre-University College, Prakashpalya for his studies. Raju is grateful to BOSCO and its staff, as he realises that if it had not been for the constant presence and extended support of BOSCO in his life, he wouldn't have come this far. He now has a bright future to look forward to, and he says that he owes it all to the organisation that stood by him in his greatest hour of need.



This is the story of an unusual Class 10 student.

Sony was born in Bangalore. Her family was poor, and when her two elder brothers dropped out of school and developed bad habits, her family atmosphere worsened. Sony studied in a government school and had to drop out in class 8, to take care of her sick mother and the family. Since her brothers were unsupportive, she took up a job; working as a tele caller and later, in

an internet café, for many years.





For 11 years, Sony endured a multitude of problems. Whenever she saw her friends and former classmates, she would feel sad and unfortunate for having missed out on school and the chance to enjoy her life. At 21, Sony ended up getting married to a 38-year old man because her parents had not adequately checked out the person. Since the alliance had already been finalised, Sony was pressured to overcome her reluctance for the marriage.

After her marriage, Sony discovered that her husband was a painter, earning a low income. As a mother of two children, she dreamed of sending them to an English-medium school, for which, she decided to take up a job and start earning.

Don Bosco Makkalalaya (DBM) (BREADS' partner in Mysuru) has a back-to-school/college initiative for school/PUC dropouts. On learning about it, Sony was thrilled at the opportunity and joined DBM in 2022, in the direct SSLC programme.

Sony shares, "When I joined DBM, I was happy because I made good friends, especially with the teachers. Don Bosco is teaching me the value of life and how to lead a meaningful life. I will always be grateful to DBM for laying the foundation of my education and enabling me to continue my studies."

At 30 years of age, and almost a life later, this mother of two children, has achieved her first milestone by passing the Class 10 exam with 41%. Sony plans to continue her studies and is interested in becoming a lab technician. A remarkable achievement, indeed!



BREADS knows and appreciates that Raju and Sony would not be setting out on the next stages of their empowerment journey, if not for the generous support of people like YOU, who care to give a person in need, a chance at life.
