CHILD RIGHTS EDUCATION AND ACTION MOVEMENT PHASE I

Children's Voice for Child Rights



CREAM (2012 – 2015) was one of the major projects of BREADS implemented in 10 districts of Karnataka viz. Bidar, Yadagiri, Kalaburagi, Raichur, Bellary, Davangere, Chitradurga, Bangalore, Ramanagara and Mysore from the past 4 years. The programme aimed at educating children, adults and stakeholders about different perspectives of child rights and to empower children to participate & voice for enhancing the present child protection setup. During the course of implementation, 97900 children were trained and 907 Child Right Clubs were formed involving 53895 children. CREAM has also implicated the adult stakeholders for protection of child rights, a total of 17667 stakeholders including 611 teachers were trained. 198 stakeholder taskforces were formed and the CREAM

Child right Clubs network meetings have complimented the process of addressing the child right issues. All these activity has made a great impact in participation of children and community in protection of child rights. The statistics of few quantifiable results achieved in 10 districts are mentioned below.

CREAM Phase II

Inspired by the impact and empowerment of children, BREADS has now launched the second phase of CREAM (2016 – 2019) to reach more children. CREAM II, thus embarks on a huge responsibility to take on the learnings from CREAM I, and further enrich the model. The CREAM I model will be replicated with modifications and the system established in the past years will be followed up to make it self-reliant to protect and promote child rights. The CREAM phase II was officially launched on 5th July 2016. Mr. Tanvir Sait, Minister of Primary and Secondary Education & Minority Welfare, Government of Karnataka, officially launched the second phase of the "Child Rights Education and Action Movement (CREAM), at Shasakara Bhavana, Vidhana Soudha. The prime activities envisaged in CREAM II are listed below.

- Formation and strengthening of 780 Child Rights Clubs
- ◆ Training for 75000 new and 75000 old children
- Supplementary education for 7000 children
- ◆ Training for 9400 stakeholders including community members, teachers, youth, PRI members, Government officials and community leaders
- Formation and strengthening of 550 task force units
- Advocacy and CRC network actions at state and district level.
