## Don Bosco Centre for Social Action, Yadagiri - Strengthening partners for empowerment



Don Bosco Centre for Social Action (DBCSA) was established in 2003 with a vision to establish institutions that would cater to the needs of children and youth from economically poor backgrounds. Almost a decade old now, the centre has reached out to more than 25 villages in the district through projects for educating poor children, tracing missing children, empowering women and communities.

#### **Education promotion through evening tuition centres**

DBCSA runs evening tuition classes in 24 villages in the district at the community centres and government schools for the school drop outs. This programme provides an opportunity for the drop out children to learn what the main stream kids are learning in the schools. Presently 450 drop outs and 350 school going children are provided supplementary education in these centres. DBCSA also organizes different activities for these children like children's day celebrations and picnics to help in their holistic development.



#### MCB - Missing Child Bureau

The DBCSA introduced MCB in Yadagiri, in March 2010, as part of the MCB network where complaints of missing children are registered. These children at risk are traced and restored to safety in a home in the local-



ity. The network allows complainants to lodge complaints from anywhere and follow up on the children who are rescued. So far 153 complaints have been registered. Out of the 153 missing

children, 61 have been rescued and rehabilitated successfully.

# CREAM – Child Rights Education and Action Movement

Project CREAM in Yadagiri has implemented multiple activities since its beginning in November 2012 to ensure protection and promotion of child rights in the district.





The project was initiated in 2011 with the aim of enabling women to realize economic sustainability. The women are brought together in Self Help Groups (SHGs) and encouraged to take up income generating activi-

ties.

ently the project administers 125 SHGs in the district, accounting for more than 40 lakh rupees through 25 community organizers.

#### registered. Out of SCLP - State Child Labour Project



The SCLP was first of its kind in Yadagiri undertaken by DBCSA. The centre collaborated with the District Child Labour Department to run the one year bridge course for rescued child labourers. 39 children were coached and mainstreamed successfully in 2012.



Between January and March 2013, 6 Child Rights Clubs have been formed, reaching out to 657 children. The children are trained on the concept and context of child rights to help them articulate their issues to adults. The project team has also obtained consent from Taluk and Zilla Panchayat to form a Task Force comprising members from the community that will be equipped to intervene in cases of child rights violations. Of late, the centre also organized a training programme for 34 teachers from government and private schools on Human Rights Education. The teachers were taught to educate children in schools on the same.
