DIRECTOR'S NOTE

As per the National Census 2011, there are close to 10.1 million child labourers in India, in the age group of 5 to 14 years. About 1.4 million child labourers in India in the age group of 7-14 years can't write their names, analysis of Census data, reveals. This means one in three child labourers in the said age group are illiterate. This is the grim reality of children who work for more than six months in a year. A shocking 2 million of these marginal workers have compromised their education as well. We are approaching 8th Anniversary of Right to Free and Compulsory Education and it is crucial that state reviews its strategies in order to reverse this trend.

World Day Against Child Labour- 2017 In conflicts and disasters, protect children from child labour



The issue of child labour is not a new concept in the Indian context and has evolved over time with its negative impact. Since independence, India has grown financially, scientifically and technologically; however, the issue of child labour remained one of the unresolved problems. Studies reveal that poverty, unemployment and migration are the prime reasons for child labour in India. Every year, millions of children around the world are deprived of their childhood and pushed to work under hideous and hazardous situations; thereby denying their basic right to live a dignified life, right to education and right to be free from any form of exploitation. Though there are laws banning child labour, yet children continue to be exploited as cheap labour. The implementation of these laws on the ground is a major failure on the part of the government and concerned

authorities, who are responsible for creating a protective environment for children.

International Labour Organization (ILO) launched the World Day Against Child Labour (WDACL) in 2002 to raise awareness and to eradicate child labour worldwide. Since then, June 12th is globally observed as World Day Against Child Labour. The theme for WDACL 2017 is "In conflicts and disasters, protect children from child labour".

Terense Loyd's childhood was different from his friends. The responsibility of his family consisting of mother and four siblings landed on his shoulders at a very young age. At the age of 13, he stopped his education to support his mother and family. He tried all possible ways to support his family-working in a factory, welding, painting or working as a driver. While he was working in a convent, one of the sisters inspired him to continue his education and referred him to Don Bosco Makkalalaya, Mysore. It was a turning point in his life. He decided to pursue his education and wrote the SSLC exam in 2011, after a gap of eight years and passed with a second class. Later, he successfully completed PUC and began to pursue Bachelor of Arts at the Karnataka State Open University (KSOU) Mysore. Currently he works as a driver, community organizer and social activist under the CREAM project at Don Bosco Makkalalaya.
