"Govt must not spend on weddings", said Spoorthi from Davangere, the Vice President of the Karnataka State Network for Child Rights Clubs under the CREAM (Child Rights Education and Action Movement) project. She participated in the State Level Child Rights Meet (Children's Parliament), which was organized by Karnataka Child Rights Observatory, a consortium of non-governmental organizations on 22nd November 2013.

She said there is no need for the government to spend on Shaadi Bhaqya scheme under which financial assistance is given to women from certain sections of the society; instead she wanted the money to be spent on educating girls. In this meet 65 children aged between 9 and 18 from 29 districts of Karnataka raised issues concerning children to the Minister for Primary and Secondary Education, Kimmane Ratnakar and to other members of Legislative Assembly. Their grievances consisted of a wide range of issues ranging from health, education, sanitation to poor infrastructure in schools. It is a new beginning. It is time for change. And through participating in forums like this, children, especially girls are able to articulate their rights and voice their concerns.
